## RECENT RELEASES

### On Christmas Night (Exeter College Chapel Choir) OXCD-135

This is the **Chapel Choir of Exeter College**, Oxford's first recording of festive music since it became a mixed-voice choir in 1996, exactly twenty years ago. It is also the choir's first project that has come to fruition using the resource of crowdfunding. This means that every penny you spent on purchasing it goes directly into supporting the choir's growing performance and outreach work. Directed by **Tim Muggeridge** with organist **Bartosz Thiede**.
